Letter to the Confirmation Class of 2010

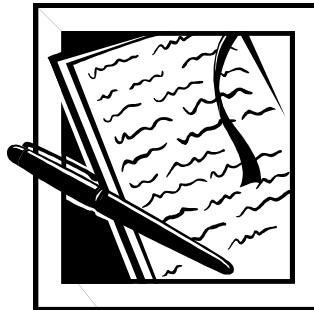
Dear Confirmation Class of 2010-

Do you remember when we sat down to our very first Confirmation class? We tried a game to remember everyone's name. We kept circling the table saying "hi" to each person over and over again. We watched a couple of video clips- one from Forrest Gump who was just running and running with a bunch of people who followed Forrest without having any idea why they were following him. They were just a bunch of folks who knew each other's names, but did not have any understanding about why they were doing what they were doing.

My hunch is that not all of you had a strong understanding why we were gathering at Confirmation other than someone thought it would be a "good idea" for you to attend. Yet as we continued to gather we began to gain a deeper appreciation of what it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ in the midst of the people who are in our every-day-walking-around-lives. We found out that our every-day lives included things like cell phone calls and texts and questions like "who cleans this table?" Our everyday lives also included conversations like "is everyone going to heaven?" and "do we all sin?"

You have been by far the most inquisitive confirmation class I have taught. That has been your gift to me, because when a person asks questions it is a sign that you are engaged in learning. Granted some of the questions were not "on topic" but even those questions brought us into a deeper understanding of grace and faith. The apostles had all kinds of questions for their teacher as well. However, their "rabbi" always had answers and was much more patient.

Those disciples were not asked to interview people as to why they did or did not attend church, or go to a Church Conference meeting where people made motions by saying "all in favor say aye" or talked about who was going to serve on what committee. There were no committee meetings or Administrative Council to take notes at. Nor was there any conversation about how many Wisemen were at the stable. (None.) Nor at the end of each class would they stand in a circle with one person in the middle and bless them, but we did.



Some see Confirmation as a type of graduation. While it is a rite of passage, I would not want to be held responsible for offering a condensed all encompassing course that provides you with everything you will need to know about the Christian faith. I hope you did learn your faith is something that will continue to be matured depending on how you desire to nurture and grow in it. So continue to bring your questions- seek out answers in the Bible and through prayer. Be active within a congregation because it is in the midst of God's people we grow stronger in faith.

But if you learned nothing else, I hope you understand that grace is a gift Christ offers to us without price to us. It is what makes Christianity unique among other faith practices. We can have forgiveness of sin and everlasting life by just asking God for it. It is always available. God's love surrounds you always- be open to God's embracing arms. He knows your name. "Do not be afraid, I've redeemed you. I've called your name. You are mine." Isaiah 43:1
